

BROWN COUNTY VOLUNTEER SERVICES

Mission: To connect caring volunteers to vulnerable individuals and families with goals of promoting self-sufficiency, and enriching lives through support and encouragement.



PALS

Mentoring for children referred by Brown County Child Protective Services. Matches are based on compatibility and can continue for as long as both parties are interested.

Time Commitment: Volunteers get together with their Pal 2-3x/month. A minimum commitment of 1 year is requested.

PARENT PALS

Mentoring for parents referred by Brown County Child Protective Services. Mentors often spend time helping parents with minor children develop new skills that empower the family to live and function in a safe and healthy manner. Matches are based on compatibility and can continue for as long as both parties are interested

Time Commitment: Volunteers get together with their Pal 2-3x/month. A minimum commitment of 1 year is requested.

FAMILY INTERACTION

Volunteers accompany children, who are in out of home care, and their parents as they play, chat and spend quality time with one another. Volunteers assist the Department in providing a safe space for families to be together.

Time Commitment: The volunteer's time commitment is flexible and determined by the hours they want to work. Typically, volunteers are with the same family at a consistently schedule time each week.



VOLUNTEER DRIVER

Volunteers transport children involved with Brown County Health and Human Services programs to and from visits with their family, appointments, school, or other activities.

Time Commitment: The volunteer's time commitment is flexible and determined by the hours they want to work. Typically, volunteers are with the same family at a consistently schedule time each week.

VOLUNTEER GUARDIANS

A legal guardian is an advocate and decision maker for those who are deemed incompetent due to aging, a developmental disability, a chronic mental illness or substance abuse. Guardians ensure that the individual's rights to proper housing, nutrition, and medical care are met.

Time Commitment: A guardian is expected to visit their ward monthly and complete an annual report. Additional time may be warranted based on the needs of the ward.

All programs include:
An application process followed by orientation and training.
